WE ARE ONE IN CHRIST

A very warm welcome back to all of our staff, students, parents and carers in our All Saints Family.

It has been a very busy first fortnight in school, with our new Year 7 students settling in to the rhythm of secondary school life, well supported by our older students, helping them to find their way around the site, what to do at lunchtime etc.

This gets to the heart of what it is to be a part of the All Saints Family. In his letter to the Corinthians, St Paul Reminds us,

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ... God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. **If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together.**"

During their time with us at All Saints, we want the students to understand that these small actions to support each other are actually leading us on our path to holiness: to sainthood!

Theme of the Week : Forgiveness

This week, Mr Bonnar led year 7-11 in assembly. He spoke of the life of Corrie ten Boom, a concentration camp survivor, who, by the power of prayer was able to forgive a man who was responsible for the death of many people, including her own sister.

The students heard of some concrete ways in which to find the power to choose to forgive others and live with peace in their hearts. They learned that we can read about the power of mercy in the Old Testament, find the words we need to cry out in pain when we have been wronged in the Psalms, and use the concrete example of the life of Christ in the New Testament to understand why we need to forgive, and how do really go about this like Jesus did.

YEAR 12 WELCOME MASS

On Tuesday 5th September, we were delighted to be joined by Father Jean-Laurent of Holy Family Parish, who celebrated Mass for our new Year 12 students.

This was a Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit, using readings and psalms that might often be heard at a



confirmation Mass, or at Pentecost. We invoked the Holy Spirit to guide the students and to empower them in their studies over the next two years with the grace of his gifts.

SAINTS OF THE MONTH



St. Vincent de Paul - 27th September

St Vincent was the founder of the Congregation of the Mission (Lazarists, or Vincentians) for preaching missions to the peasantry and for educating and training a pastoral clergy. The patron saint of charitable societies, St. Vincent de Paul is primarily recognized for his charity and compassion for the poor, though he is also known for his reform of the clergy and for his early role in opposing the heresy of Jansenism.



Saint Therese of Lisieux - 1st October

St Therese was a Carmelite nun whose service to her Roman Catholic order, although outwardly unremarkable, was later recognized for its exemplary spiritual accomplishments. She was named a doctor of the church by Pope John Paul II in 1997. She is a patron saint of missions and of florists.

Prayer by Saint Bridget for Our Lady of Sorrows (15th September)

O Blessed Virgin Mary, Immaculate Mother of God, who didst endure a martyrdom of love and grief, beholding the sufferings and sorrows of Jesus! Thou didst co-operate in the benefit of my redemption by thy innumerable afflictions and by offering to the Eternal Father His only-begotten Son as a holocaust and victim of propitiation for my sins. I thank thee for the unspeakable love which led thee to deprive thyself of the Fruit of thy womb, Jesus, true God and true Man, to save me, a sinner. Oh! make use of the unfailing intercession of thy sorrows with the Father and the Son, that I may steadfastly amend my life and never again crucify my loving Redeemer by new sins; arid that, persevering till death in His grace, I may obtain eternal life through the merits of His Cross and Passion.
