#### **ASSEMBLY FOCUS**

#### <u>"Stewards of God's Creation" - Mr Pauro</u> <u>w/c 30th September</u>

Marking the feast of St Francis of Assisi on the 4th October, Mr Pauro spoke to all students about the importance of stewardship of creation, but in particular to first take the time to really notice the beauty in the world. We looked at St Francis of Assisi, who, realising that the monetary wealth and comfort he had growing up was not leading to a fulfilling life, gave up all material goods and immersed himself in the natural world, relying on God's providence for sustenance and serving the poorest in society. Mr Pauro challenged the All Saints family to think about one thing that they could put aside or do away with so as to be less distracted by worldly things and more focussed on the goodness of God all around us.

Marking the feast of St John Henry Newman on the 9th of October, Mrs McCoy led a week of assemblies on Newman's writing, which emphasised that not only is each person created in God's image, but that God has also given everyone a unique set of gifts to use for a particular mission in life. The focus on each person as a 'link in a chain', being the strongest link possible for each other led to a challenge to each one of us to use the talents we have been given for the glory of God.





On Thursday 10th October, our CAFOD Young Leaders attended their first training session at the Jesuit Centre in London.
