Sunday 30th April - 4th Sunday of Easter "I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep and my own know me."

### Regina Caeli - Queen of Heaven



At All Saints we drop everything and pray at midday, to the sound of Church bells ringing around the school site. During Eastertide, the midday prayer of the Church changes from the Angelus to the Regina Caeli (Queen of Heaven).

Students have been enthusiastically learning this new prayer, with the resounding 'Alleluia' which helps us to remain in the joy of the resurrection.

- V. Has risen, as he said, alleluia.

- V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.
- R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

#### SAINTS OF THE MONTH

#### This month,. Church offers to us many remarkable men and women, who should inspire us and encourage us in the pursuit of holiness. Here are three for you to reflect on this fortnight:

Saint Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort April 28th

Louis de Montfort was a French priest, living in the 17th and 18th centuries, who believed he was called by God to help to renew the Christian life of the people of the West of France by his preaching of parish missions, and especially through devotion to Mary, the mother of Jesus and mother of the Church.

Opposed at times in his preaching and in his other ministries, Louis knew with Saint Paul, "Neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who causes the growth" (1 Corinthians 3:7) Saint Louis de Montfort is known for his particular devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and the practice of praying the rosary.



Saint Athanasius of Alexandria May 2nd

St. Athanasius of Alexandria was the 20th Bishop of Alexandria. His Episcopate lasted 45 years from June 8, 328 to May 2, 373. Also known as Athanasius the Great and Athanasius the Confessor, he was a bishop and doctor of the church. He is called the "Father of Orthodoxy," the "Pillar of the Church" and "Champion of Christ's Divinity." Athanasius became one of the most dedicated opponents of the heresy of Arianism. Much of his life was a testimony to the divinity of Jesus Christ. Over 17 years of his being Bishop was spent in five exiles, ordered by four different Roman Emperors. Athanasius is the patron saint of the defence of the faith, as he courageously stood up against the Arian heresy and defended the divinity of Christ.



Saint Dominic Savio May 6th

Dominic Savio was born in the small village of San Giovanni, near Turin, Italy, on 2 April 1842. As a small boy, he loved the Lord and the Church and showed exceptional piety and devotion in practicing his faith as a Catholic. Dominic never missed attending the Mass with his mother. He was often seen kneeling and praying before the tabernacle.

Aside from his prayerfulness, young Dominic was also quickly recognized as an excellent student and at the age of 12 he became a spiritual son of John Bosco. Under the personal direction of this great Salesian saint, Dominic became a model and example of God's love for all people. He lived as an apostle and missionary of Jesus. Dominic Savio, is the patron saint of boys, children's choirs.





## A VISITOR FOR 8 TERESA

On Thursday 20th April, 8T were treated to a surprise visit from Fr Paschal Uche during their RSE lesson, where he conducted an impromptu Q&A session. 8T asked some brilliant questions. Father Paschal also spoke about being chosen to greet Pope Benedict on behalf of all young Catholics on his Papal Visit to the UK in 2010 and the subsequent letter his mother received from the Emeritus Pope on the day of his ordination to the priesthood. Finally, he prayed for our students, and left them with a blessing.
