This was a famous saying of St John Bosco, patron saint of young people. His feast day is on the 31st January and he is particularly special to the young people at All Saints, who gather weekly as a community for assembly in the hall dedicated to his memory.

St John Bosco is a model of our RUAH values: Respect, Understanding, Affection and Humour and is someone we should all aspire to be like.

SAINTS OF THE MONTH

This fortnight we look at the lives of three saints from around the world, who were all driven with such zeal for Christ that they were able to cope with tremendous suffering. Their lives can inspire us to do the same.

St Blaise- 3rd February

Saint Blaise, Bishop and doctor of Sebaste in Armenia (modern Turkey) around 1,700 years ago. In prison, Saint Blaise was ordered to renounce his faith. He refused so was beaten with wool combs and beheaded. He is venerated as the patron saint of sufferers from throat diseases and of wool combers. St Paul Miki- 6th February

Saint Paul Miki, born in Japan around 1562. was a Jesuit Priest and well-known preacher, converting many to the Catholic faith. Paul was arrested and imprisoned with 25 of his fellow Catholics. They were later forced to march over 600 miles from Kyoto to Nagasaki where he was crucified on February 5, 1597 along with his companions. St Josephine Bakhita - 8th February

Josephine Bakhita is a heroic saint who endured the horrors of slavery from the age of seven, with bravery before escaping to freedom through the group of religious sisters she joined. She is venerated as a modern African saint, the patron of human trafficking survivors.
