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Keywords and definitions:

You will need to be familiar with the following keywords in term 1.

Keyword	Definition	Use of keyword within context
Health	a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity (WHO)	
Care	means the provision of what is necessary for the health, welfare, maintenance, and protection of someone or something.	
multidisciplinary team	A multidisciplinary team involves a range of health professionals, from one or more organisations, working together to deliver comprehensive patient care	
general practitioner	A doctor who does not specialise in a specific branch of medicine but provides ongoing treatment and preventative care in the community for a variety of medical problems that may be experienced by individuals of all ages.	
consultant	A senior doctor, normally based in a hospital, who provides specialist expert healthcare support in their area of expertise	



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preventative care	Care and education that aims to ensure people remain healthy, and are aware of factors that can lead to illness and poor health. It includes screening and vaccination programme.	
health screening	The process of checking for presence of disease in individuals who have no signs or symptoms of the illness.	
antenatal care	Care provided for a mother and her baby before the birth of the baby	
postnatal care	Care provided for a mother and her baby after the birth of her baby.	
nurse practitioner	Provides expert consultancy service to patients and their carers. They contribute to the management and development of the care provisions. They also undertake research and contribute to the education and training of other members of staff.
