What are the different ways we can learn about Jesus?

We can learn about Jesus by reading the Gospels

John 3:16 in the Bible says, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life".

We can learn about Jesus during Mass

- The bread and wine are transformed into the real presence of Jesus Christ.
- Jesus draws close to us through the Eucharist to unite us to Him and transform us.
- He is present in the Word, the bread, and the wine during the Mass.
- The holy Eucharist is the most intense manifestation of Christ's presence.

We can learn about Jesus through prayer

When we spend time in prayer to Him, waiting on Him, reading His holy Word in the Bible and listening, we begin to know His voice. It will help us to live for Him, to discern truth from error and to walk in obedience by the power of the Holy Spirit that is at work in His followers.

We can learn about Jesus through CST

Catholic Social Teaching (CST) refers to the official teachings of the Catholic Church on matters of public life, including politics, society, and economics. CST, like every aspect of the life of the Church, is rooted in discipleship with Christ. Through CST, the Church seeks to leaven society, inspiring justice and peace through faith in Jesus.

We can learn about Jesus through praying the Rosary.

We might also describe the rosary as a "contemplative catechism," for we deepen our relationship with Jesus and his Church through **reflecting on the key events of his life**: his conception, birth, and boyhood; his preaching the kingdom and instituting the Eucharist; his suffering and death; and his triumph over sin and death in rising from the dead.
